

Hockey Rens win 5th in row, tie for lead

The Grand River Renegades of Kitchener moved into a two-way share of first place in the Waterloo County Secondary School Athletic Association boys hockey league standings Friday.

Rallying from a one-goal deficit early in the second period, the Rens chalked up their fifth victory in the same number of starts with a 5-4 triumph over the Eastwood Rebels of Kitchener at Grand River Arena.

"That was a good, tough game and something we needed to get focused on the season," head coach Brian Millar said after the Rens got a third-period goal from defenceman Chris Ebel to break a 4-4 tie.

The meeting of two teams considered among the top three in the league (the Forest Heights Trojans are also 5-0) was to be one of three season-opening games on Tuesday, Nov. 19.

However, that was the afternoon when Grand

River goaltender Shawn Kempel collapsed outside the Wilson Arena and was rushed to the hospital. He died 10 days later from a still-unexplained cause. Pat Kempel, Shawn's mother, said Friday she expected to hear soon the results of the coroner's autopsy.

Millar called Friday's effort "a character builder" for a team which is struggling to cope with the death of their teammate.

"All the circumstances surrounding the death of Shawn had us behind schedule in terms of preparing for the season. We didn't have a lot of good practices after the incident and you can understand why. But a good tough game like today was a solid effort and I liked the idea that we came back," Millar said.

In addition to the winning goal from Ebel, the Rens got one goal each from Casey Kesselring, Cam Stauch, Andy Lavelle and Duane Halpenenny.

Millar was also pleased some recent practice work on Grand River's power play, under the direction of assistant coach Dave Cressman,

paid dividends when two of the Renegades' goals came with the Rens a man short.

After trailing 2-0 at the end of the first period, Eastwood exploded for three goals in 36 seconds early in the second to charge into a 3-2 lead. Grand River got two goals late in the period for a 4-3 lead but Eastwood tied the game a second time early in the final period.

Kevin Kulker had two goals for the Rebels while singles went to Jamie Ferreira and Todd Wilson.

The loss was Eastwood's second disappointment in two days. One afternoon earlier, the previously unbeaten Rebels, now 4-1-1, had to settle for a 2-2 tie with the last-place Elmira Lancers.

All three of WCSSAA's top teams and the Lancers will be in the top-rated Terry Fox conference of the annual 32-team Waterloo Collegiate Christmas Invitational hockey tournament scheduled for five K-W arenas next Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

Netminder in hospital

K-W teen collapses before school game

A high school hockey player was in the intensive care unit at St. Mary's General Hospital after collapsing prior to a game at the Wilson Arena on Tuesday afternoon.

Teammates say Shawn Kempel, an 18-year-old goaltender with the Grand River Renegades of Kitchener, was walking into the arena after leaving the team bus when he fell unconscious to the ground.

Hospital officials would not release details of Kempel's condition this morning, but his sister, Lori, indicated Tuesday that Shawn had not yet gained consciousness.

"Right now, he's still in the intensive care and they just don't know what happened," Lori Kempel said Tuesday. "I'm told they have to wait 24 hours before saying anything."

Lori also said her brother had no prior health problems that she knew of and that Shawn had not complained recently of feeling ill.

Reached at his home, Grand River coach Brian Millar was naturally shaken by what had happened and preferred not to comment specifically on the incident.

But Grand River principal Gary Boug said: "It's my understanding that they are performing an EEG (electroencephalogram) as soon as possible and that he's in intensive care, somewhat stabilized with ventilation assistance."

Boug said he has already met with the rest of the team to discuss Kempel's condition, and "I told them at that time that it's important for us all to hope and pray for the best."

"It's important to get that point across early, even for (the rest of) our students," Boug said.

"When it's a school activity, you deal with a lot of people and the rumors start. It's one of my jobs to make sure they (the students) are clear about what has happened, and what is going on."

The game against the Eastwood Rebels, the Renegades' first in the Waterloo County Secondary School Athletic Association's regular season, was cancelled, as was this morning's practice.

Jeff Kube, a teammate of Kempel's, said the goaltender had not given any indication something was wrong during the bus ride from the school, leading his teammates to believe Kempel had simply fallen or was fooling around.

"At first, people just thought he tripped or hit his head," Kube said. "People were saying 'Get up.' But once we realized the extent of it, the

coach came back. I guess he (the coach) knew mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and someone from the other team with first-aid experience came along to help out too."

Obviously a popular player among his teammates, Kempel's collapse has many of them wondering exactly what has happened.

"It was strange," Kube said. "He was just walking off the bus as if it were any other game. But once he got to the (arena) door, he collapsed."

"It was just like a regular day. I was talking to him before the game and he was fine. It's a shock. I don't know how to explain it. People are taking it well but the worst part is not knowing how he's doing."

Kube could not say if Kempel regained consciousness at all while waiting for an ambulance since he and most of the players had backed away from the scene.

A diminutive figure at 5-foot-5 and about 125 pounds, Kempel was a big factor in the Renegades run at the WCSSAA championship last year. He was also the team's starting goaltender in their unsuccessful bid for an Ontario title.

Sombre Rens win one for ailing goalie

It was a sombre dressing room at Don McLaren Arena Tuesday afternoon.

There was some chatter among a few players but others sat slumped on the benches along the walls, slowing unacing skates, staring blankly off into space or just unwinding after two hours of high school hockey.

Despite the subdued atmosphere, it was not the dressing room of a losing team.

In fact, the Grand River Renegades of Kitchener had just officially launched their portion of the 1991-92 Waterloo County Secondary School Athletic Association boys hockey schedule with an 8-3 victory over the Kitchener-Waterloo (KCW) Raiders.

However, the ecstasy of victory has been tempered by the uncertainty of fate and the suddenly all-too-clear fragility of life and death.

One week earlier, the defending playoff-champion Renegades were supposed to open the WCSSAA schedule at Wilson Arena but the game was postponed after the Rens 18-year-old goaltender Shawn Kempel mysteriously collapsed as he entered the arena.

Today, the popular 5-foot-5 125-pound student lies unconscious in St. Mary's Hospital where he was rushed last week. Jerry Kempel, Shawn's father, said "Tuesday night that his son's condition has not changed since he was admitted. The elder Kempel said simply: 'It is not good.'"

"Our thoughts and our prayers are with him every day," said Grand River teacher-coach Brian Millar who, along with Eastwood hockey player Todd Wilson, administered CPR on the stricken youth before an ambulance arrived at the arena.

None of Shawn's teammates wanted to discuss the situation Tuesday but Millar said each player deals with it in his own way. "Gary (Grand River principal Gary Boug) was great with the team last week after this happened. He got them all together and talked to them about facing the uncertainty of this," said Millar.

"When the guys do say something about Shawn, they are all positive in their outlook. He's going to be OK. He's coming back... that sort of thing. They're feeling down about what has happened but they're staying with him." In their first game since the incident, all members of the Renegades have the initials S K on their helmets.

In the game Tuesday, Cam Stauch led Grand River with a three-goal performance while Casey Kesselring and Chris Palubski had two each. Singles went to Renegade Duane Halpeny and KCW's Jason Stuebing, Kyle Gray and Jeff Bingenman.

Kempel remains unconscious

Shawn Kempel remains in the intensive care unit at St. Mary's General Hospital, three days after the high school hockey player collapsed prior to a league game in Kitchener.

"He's still unconscious so they can't really do anything for him until he regains consciousness," Shawn's mother, Pat Kempel, said Thursday afternoon.

"They don't know yet what has happened, and apparently they won't know until he regains consciousness and they do further testing."

Hospital officials have refused to release de-

tails of Kempel's condition, though his mother confirmed an electroencephalogram has been conducted.

A goaltender with the Grand River Renegades of the Waterloo County Secondary School Athletic Association, Shawn collapsed outside the Wilson Arena after leaving the team bus Tuesday afternoon.

Teammates say Kempel had not complained of feeling ill during the bus ride from the school, but had been talking and joking with them prior to collapsing.
